PSYCHIATRIST

The London InterCommunity Health Centre is looking for a registered psychiatrist to provide mental health consultation, assessment and treatment planning to some of London's most marginalized populations as part of an interdisciplinary team of clinical and allied health professionals.

The role of a psychiatrist within our environment is to provide consultation to our team of physicians and nurse practitioners working with clients experiencing complex mental health challenges, provide psychiatric assessment and develop treatment plans including prescribing alongside our medical staff to support clients ongoing mental health needs.

The incumbent should be familiar with DSM diagnosis criteria as well as assessment tools and techniques and general psychiatric principles. The incumbent should also be familiar with the unique challenges experienced by our client populations, which can include refugees, people experiencing homelessness, substance use and mental health challenges along with other challenges related to the social determinants of health.

QUALIFICATIONS

- A Medical degree in the field of psychiatry
- Current registration with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario
- Demonstrated experience with mental health diagnoses and treatment options
- Experience working with clients who have experienced severe trauma
- Experience in community-based practice

RELATIONSHIP STRUCTURE

LIHC is funded for psychiatry services by the Canadian Mental Health Association and uses a sessional model of practice. Sessions are typically three-hour blocks billable at a set rate. More information about this structure can be requested at the time of expression of interest.
