PSYCHOLOGIST

The London InterCommunity Health Centre is looking for a registered clinical psychologist to provide mental health support to some of London's most marginalized populations as part of an interdisciplinary team of clinical and allied health professionals.

The role of the psychologist is to provide clinical services including assessment, psychometric measurement, treatment plans and especially trauma care psychotherapy (as per the APA guidelines on evidence-based outcomes).

The incumbent of this position should be familiar as well with other evidence-based interventions for ancillary mood, thinking and personality difficulties. The incumbent should also be familiar with the unique challenges experienced by our client populations, which can include refugees, people experiencing homelessness, substance use and mental health challenges along with other challenges related to the social determinants of health.

QUALIFICATIONS

- A Ph.D from an accredited institution, a Master's degree in Clinical Psychology (Psychology Associate) will be considered in conjunction with relevant experience
- Current registration with the College of Psychologists of Ontario
- Demonstrated experience with cognitive-behavioural interventions and evaluations including testing and interpretation of results
- A minimum of 3 years of recent experience in psychological treatment of mental disorders including trauma care psychotherapy
